

International Summer Tanakh Experience at Herzog College

This year Herzog College is expanding its Yemei Iyun offerings, with an additional pedagogy day in English aimed at teachers in English speaking countries, together with classes in French and Spanish.

July 18-19 A full schedule of English language classes as part of the Yemei Iyun B'Tanakh with classes focusing on: Sefer Bereishit, Sefer Bemidbar, Nevi'im U'Ketuvim and Parshanut/Peshat and Drash.

**** The program is modular, so participants can choose to register for the pedagogy classes and foreign language classes interspersed with regular Hebrew language classes that will be taking place throughout the week.**

English Field Trips

- The general field trip day for the Yemei Iyun takes place on July 5th, **ten days before the study days**. There will be one field trip in English on that day, which will begin in Jerusalem like all of the Hebrew field trips. See pages 18-19 for details.
- On Tuesday ה' במנחם-אב (July 17th), during the week of the Yemei Iyun, there will be two special Tanakh-based tours in English. Tour numbers for registration are #196 and #197. The tours will leave at 9:30 AM from the parking area near the Yeshiva in Alon Shevut and will return at 5 PM. Lunch is not included in the tours. Participants in the tours can register to travel to the Yeshiva with the regular transportation of the Yemei Iyun.
- Registration for all English field trips is done via the same system as the classes, under "סיורים".

Full Cost

- Adults: Each day of the program – 195 NIS, Field trip days – 220 NIS
- Youth (up to 30 years old): Study days - 156 NIS, Field trip days – 176 NIS

Reduced cost – For online registration before July 1

- Adults: Each day of the program – 175 NIS, Field trip days – 200 NIS
- Youth (up to 30 years old): Study days - 140 NIS, Field trip days – 160 NIS
